PUBLIC PROCUREMENT MANAGEMENT DURING COVID-19 PERIOD IN CAMEROON





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INTRODUCTION

The pandemic of coronavirus (COVID-19) declared in December 2019 in China spread out in Asia, America, Europe and Africa



CAMEROON is not spared from its negative consequences in almost all activity sectors including the one of Public Procurement.

INTRODUCTION (Continuity)

Several governmental response measures against the pandemic, namely:

- closure of land, air and maritime frontiers;
- Suspension of the issuance of entry visas to Cameroon;
- closure of public and private training centers;
- forbiddance to gather more than 50 persons;
- town and intercity travel restrictions.



IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON PUBLIC PROCUREMENT SYSTEM

Major Difficulties from Public Procurement System Principal Players

For the State (Project Managers):

- ► Reduction and reorientation of operating and capital expenses through a budget package (Ordinance n° 2020/001 of June 3, 2020)
- ► Absence in the Public Procurement Code, of public procurement procedure for goods and services in accordance with the imperious needs and considerations related to the current news



IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON PUBLIC PROCUREMENT SYSTEM (continuity)

Major Difficulties from Public Procurement System Principal Players

For Public Procurement Candidates:

Findings of a study by the Inter-Patronal Group of Cameroon (GICAM):

- severe cash flow constraints;
- ► disruption in supply chains;
- ► increase in production costs;
- reduction of working hours.



IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON PUBLIC PROCUREMENT SYSTEM (continuity and end)

Consequences of Recorded Difficulties:

- Trouble in the implementation of procurement in process (Start-up delay);
- © Cancellation or postponement of several projects programmed by Project Managers
- Loss of international competitive bidding procedures;
- Withholding of seminars for the outreach of the new normative framework;
- Persistence of irregularities in the procedures;
- Slowness in the procurement of fighting tools against COVID-19.



MITIGATION MEASURES

1) Use of Exceptional and Derogative Procedures:

- Procurement of equipment, consumables and performance of services dedicated to the response against COVID-19 admitted to the derogative regime of Special Contracts;
- Increase in over-the-counter contracting;
- Exemption of several goods from certain taxes and customs duties (equipment and consumables purchased for the sake of the fight against the pandemic).

MITIGATION MEASURES (continuity)

2) Adaptation of Work Environments:

- Generally, following the social distancing measures, administrations give priority to electronic and digital means of communication.
- Especially in Public Procurement, great promotion of virtual procedures already in use (Circular n° 007/LC/MINMAP /CAB of March 25, 2020).

MITIGATION MEASURES (continuity)

2) Adaptation of Work Environments (continuity):

Dematerialization of procedures started some years ago:

- COLEPS Platform (Cameroon On-Line E. Procurement System) for online contracts: possibility to submit a bid online;
- PRIDESOFT, an open and multiform integrated management system of public procurement dedicated to the management of market information (BD):daily publication of the online Public Procurement Journal,
- Online issuance of administrative documents required for tenderers' offers: Public Procurement non-Exclusion certificate, certificate of no tax liability, etc.



MITIGATION MEASURES (continuity and end)

3) Update of Public Procurement Programming Logs:

- ➤ In practice, public procurement planning of fiscal year n during the preceding fiscal year n-1.
- Update of public procurement programming logs and plans for the fiscal year 2020 by some Project Managers.
